


# Class 9 and 10 Newsletter Autumn Term

#### Don't Forget...

Reading Books and Diaries need to be brought to school every day even if your child has not completed the book. Your child will be given the opportunity to change it once it has been completed. We expect the children to read to an adult at home at least three times per week. They must hand their reading diaries in on a Thursday to be checked.

#### Homework

As well as reading regularly, your child will also be given Maths Booklet. This will be sent home each Friday and will need to be returned by Thursday of the following week. We ask that these booklets be kept in your child's school bag and brought to school each day.

#### Useful Information

- PE will usually be on a Monday (Class 9) and Tuesday (class 10). Please ensure your child has their PE kit in school and earrings are removed or taped over with plasters.
- Class 9 and 10 children will go swimming this year and we will let you know closer to the time when this will be and what swimming kit children will need.
- Please ensure your child's name is inside of all of their uniform, including PE kit and shoes.
- Children are asked to use the red bags provided as we have limited cloakroom space.

### We are learning.....

Our first topic is 'What were the wonders of Egypt?' In this topic we will be studying the achievements of the ancient Egyptians in History and making an Egyptian shaduf in Design Technology. In Art, we will be developing our sculpture skills, taking inspiration from the ancient Egyptians to create a Canopic jar or a death mask. Our educational visit to the Oriental Museum will allow us to view artefacts as well as a real life mummy! We will be looking at where Egypt is in Geography as well as exploring time zones and the earth's hemispheres and we will learn about the Arctic and Antarctic Circles. In our English lessons we will be making links between our reading and writing, using extracts, short stories and longer novels including, 'The Pharaohs of Ancient Egypt' by Elizabeth Payne and 'There's a Pharaoh in Our Bath' by Jeremy Storing. In Science, we will be exploring Earth and space, learning about the different planets in our solar system.
