### Remote education provision: information for parents

This information is intended to provide clarity and transparency to pupils and parents or carers, about what to expect from remote education in the event of individual pupils or groups of pupils need to self-isolate, but the rest of the school is still open; or if there are local or national restrictions that mean most pupils need to stay at home. This information has been developed to provide guidance for parent in such instances and is to be read in conjunction with the Remote Learning Policy and COVID – 19 Risk Assessment. There may be instances which are not covered by this guidance and each case will be reviewed individually.

Pupils	Curriculum
In the event of a child self-isolating whilst waiting for test results (short term).	<p>The following message will be sent to the parents via Class Dojo</p> <p>I am sorry to hear ***** is not in school today as you are waiting the results of a COVID test. Please see our school website for links to sites which will support your child's learning whilst they are absent. Please also encourage your child to play TT Rockstars/Numbots (delete as appropriate) and read at home. I hope to see ***** back in school soon, however, if the COVID test is positive and they are required to self-isolate for longer I will set daily activities via Class Dojo. If you have queries, please let me know. Thank you for your continued support.</p>
In the event of a child receiving a positive test and being in isolation for 10 days, assuming they feel well.	<p>Work will be set daily via Class Dojo. These tasks will follow the class' usual curriculum and be reflective of the work children would be completing if they were in school.</p> <p>Children are set 3 tasks per day. In a week this should include 4 maths, 4 English, 5 foundation subjects.</p>
In the event of a child in isolation for 10 days	<p>Children in KS2 are also asked to read daily and practise their times tables using TT Rockstars.</p>
In the event of shielding – longer term absence	<p>It is expected that this work should take KS1 children 3 hours to complete and KS2 children 4 hours to complete.</p> <p>Pre-School children are set one task per day based on an area of the curriculum that would be covering in school.</p> <p>Work will be uploaded to Class Dojo by 9am each day.</p> <p>Teachers and TA will be available via Class Dojo from 9.00am – 3.15pm each day for support and queries.</p>

	<p>Teachers and TAs will review the work returned by children and comment on these to provide motivation and challenge. Children will be awarded Dojo points as a reward for their work.</p> <p>Paper copies of work will be provided for children who do not have access to Class Dojo.</p>
<p>In the event of an outbreak in a bubble – therefore the bubble must close or whole school closure</p>	<p>In addition to the actions above</p> <p>Daily videos from teachers are to be uploaded to Class Dojo explaining the day's tasks and providing more information on new learning as required.</p> <p>Teachers will also provide other high quality teaching resources and videos from educational providers such as National Oak Academy, White Rose Maths, Twinkl Go and BBC Bitesize.</p>
