Dear Parents,

Re: Class 10 and Class 11

We have been made aware of several children in Class 11 who have tested positive for COVID 19. We are continuing to monitor the situation and are working closely with Public Health England. Following their advice pupils in C10 and C11 will be reverting back to bubbles for 2 weeks. During playtimes, lunchtimes and lesson times they will remain in their class bubble. This letter is to inform you of the current situation and provide advice on how to support your child. Please be reassured that for most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

Swimming, music and choir lessons have all been cancelled for the next 2 weeks.

Those children that normally access Breakfast Club and After School Club can be offered an emergency place but will remain in their bubbles as advised by Public Health England.

School remains open and, providing your child remains well, they can continue to attend as normal. We will keep this under review.

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, you should organise for your child to be tested via the NHS online portal or by calling 119. Your household should isolate until you receive the test results giving the all clear.

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- new continuous cough and/or
- high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19.

- wash your hands with soap and water often – do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get home
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
